





Accommodation and Food services, Health care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade and Educational Services Employ the Most Astoria Residents

According to the U.S. Census Bureau's Local Employment Dynamics Program, of the 4,779 jobs Astoria residents held in 2018, the industries that employed the most were accommodation and food services (18.8%), health care and social assistance (16.2%), retail trade (12.3%), educational services (8.8%) manufacturing (6.6%).

Over 6 out of 10 Astoria residents worked within Clatsop County, while about 39% commuted outside the county for work. The most common cities of employment for residents were Astoria, Warrenton, Portland, Seaside and Salem.

Astoria Has Slightly Larger Shares of Residents With Some College or an Associate's Degree; Slightly Smaller Shares of Bachelor's or Higher Degrees Than State




Where do Astoria Residents Work?



Nearly 3/4 of Astoria's Workers Live in Clatsop County




How Much Do Astoria Jobs Pay?
