RE: VACATION RENTALS

You are receiving this mailing because you own and/or manage a property that operates as a lodging facility within the City limits of Astoria.

For several months, City Council has explored policy options that the City could implement to provide better oversight and regulation of lodging facilities – specifically, for vacation rentals. After many discussions, a license program is proposed to be adopted into the Astoria City Code (ACC). The most recent draft ordinance is enclosed for your review.

The ordinance proposes an annual license for vacation rentals with a required fire-life-safety inspection. The intent is to create a regulatory framework to register and monitor vacation rentals that are operating as a legal nonconforming use with standards to determine if the use has been discontinued. Additional parameters within the ordinance would include the followine:

- Creates a definition for vacation <u>rentals;</u>
- Establishes an initial license fee of \$500 and a \$250 renewal fee per calendar year for each <u>unit;</u>
- Imposes a maximum cap of 50 vacation rental <u>units;</u>
- Establishes an enforcement mechanism;
- Violations could result in suspension or revocation of license.

The City Council will hold a first reading of the proposed ordinance at their next meeting, scheduled for Monday, November 18, <u>2024</u> at 6:00pm. Remote participation is also available via Zoom. Vacation Rental Definition

Page 53 / Definitions – updated language

Vacation Rental means any structure or portion of any structure offered for dwelling, lodging, or sleeping purposes for 30 days or less, is not occupied by an owner or manager at the same time as the renters, and does not meet the definition of lodging places per ACC Section 8.700. A Vacation Rental shall include any structure or portion of structure built and/or used as a residential dwelling converted to transient lodging; and/or any existing commercial structure or portion of commercial structure converted to transient lodging and/or any new structure constructed for transient lodging of five lodging units or less. Any portion of the structure that can be rented individually shall be considered its own lodging unit.



License Application Requirements

Page 55 / A.4 – updated language

 The applicant received City approval for vacation rental as a permitted outright use, a conditional use, or the vacation rental is documented as a non-conforming use.



License Denial, Suspension, or Revocation

Page 58 / D. – updated language

The determination that a violation exists shall result in immediate suspension of the license. If the violation(s) are not cured within thirty (30) calendar days; or, if a plan to cure violation(s) has not been submitted and approved by the City within thirty (30) calendar days, the license will be revoked, effectively immediately.
