AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE NUMBERING OF BUILDINGS IN THE CITY OF ASTORIA, O'REGON, AND PRESCRIBING CERTAIN DUTIES OF THE BUILDING INSPECTOR OF THE CITY OF ASTORIA IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

The City of Astoria does ordain as follows:

Section 1. There shall be a uniform system of numbering of buildings within the city limits of the city of Astoria by placing over the main entrance, or as near as practicable, the number assigned thereto, as hereinafter provided, the figure designating the number, whether printed or otherwise, not to be less than one and three-quarter (1 3/4) inches in height.

Section 2. Odd numbers shall be given to houses on the west and south sides of the streets, avenues, and highways, and even numbers to those on the north and east side of the same.

Section 3. On streets, avenues, and highways running northerly and southerly, the said city numbering shall commence with number two (2) at Astor Street in what is known as McClure's, Shivelys's, and Adair's Astoria, and with number two (2) at each street in Alderbrook and Van Dusen's Astoria and shall increase southerly at the rate of fifty (50) numbers for each block or space between two streets, On streets, avenues, and highways running easterly and westerly, the said city numbering shall commence with number two (20) on First Street and increase, going east from there, fifty numbers for each block or space between two streets, and the same with all streets at right angles with said First Street to the eastern limits of the city.

Section 4. The building inspector of the city of Astoria shall designate the numbers of all houses, in conformity with preceding provisions, allowing a number to make the uniformity in the numbering. He shall furnish the number of each house now or hereafter bult with its proper number if it is not completed. When any house is not correctly numbered or not numbered at all, the building inspector shall give such house its proper number and require the same to be put on each house in a conspicuous place next to the street.

Section 5. In case any owner, occupant, or agent, after having been required so to do, shall refuse or neglect for the space of ten (10) days to number a house as required or shall number or attempt to number such house otherwise than in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof before the auditor and police judge, shall be punished by a fine of not less than five (5) nor more than ten (10) dollars (\$10.00) for each day's refusal or neglect, or by imprisonment in the city mail not to exceed one (1) day for each two dollars (\$2.00) of the fine so imposed.

Section 6. That Ordinance No. 1870 entitled, "An ordinance providing for the numbering of building and placing of signs with the names of streets thereon at certain places, and prescribing certain duties of the superintendent of streets in connection therewith," approved April 26, 1894, and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
